Religiously inspired anti-homosexual attitudes take the freedom of belief to excessive limits when used to drive and justify legislation that contravenes human rights or when serving as a breeding-ground for discriminatory acts or even violent attacks on people.

African LGBTI activists need support, since the struggle for their human rights is being fought in Africa too. We encourage them to form alliances with other activist groups, including church-organised LGBTIfriendly groups.

Church and non-church organisations involved in development cooperation are called on to open up to the subjects of sexual identity and human rights, strategies to eliminate homophobic prejudices, removing taboos and raising acceptance of homosexuality, and the protection of LGBTI human rights defenders.
